Thus, it is not unusual to hear "I flew to Fun Airport this weekend for a great \$100 hamburger." But, flying patients beats the satisfaction of a good hamburger many times over. So, I'm glad that PFP was there when I decided to take my love for flying and use it to help others.

Weather



Just a Reminder

+ Once you have accepted a mission, please refer to the Mission Checklist on the back of your ID badge and contact the office at 318 322 5112 if you have any questions.

H Make sure we have up to date copies of your insurance coverage and medical certificate on file at the office, even if you aren't flying right now. Please fax them to 318 388 4924.

+ Please fax or email the Hobbs time and miles as soon after you complete a mission as possible so we can complete them in our records.

+ Please take pictures (if the patient is comfortable with this) and send to the PFP office.

+ If you wish to fly a mission involving Houston, please request it as early as possible to allow time for the ground angel coordinator to find a driver. Remember, even if the available list shows EFD Ellington or another airport, we can usually change it to any Houston area airport that our partners, the Houston Ground Angels, support. Call the office if you need to change the airport on a mission you would like to fly.

PATIENTS - please contact the mission coordinator at 318-322-5112 to schedule your flight requests. Please DO NOT contact the pilots directly. All requests must go through the mission coordinator. Please call or fax your mission requests as soon as you have the dates for your next appointment.

Pilots for Patients is honored to have 2 very accomplished female pilots on our roster, Ms. Heidi Higginbotham and Florence Bethard (pictured here with patient Marie Pleasant).

Pilots for Patients is blessed to have Heidi Higginbotham as one of our Women Pilots! Her passion for flying began at the age of 14 when she began to save her money to later obtain her pilot's license. After graduating as Valedictorian of her Church Point High School Class of 2011, Heidi chose to attend The University of Louisiana at Monroe



majoring in Aviation. After settling into her new home in Monroe, Heidi began flight training at JPS Aviation.

Her first goal was reached on July 15, 2012 when she obtained her private pilot's license, followed by receiving her instrument rating on November 6th.

This young lady spent the summer of 2012 and 2013 teaching young students at Louisiana Aviation Career Education camps all over the state who share the same passion she did as a youth. She participated in the 2013 Annual Women of Aviation Worldwide's Fly it Forward program in March by taking a woman flying who had never flown in a small aircraft. Heidi joined the ULM Flight Team her freshman year and is currently the team's Captain in her junior year. She placed 2nd Top Female Pilot for this region at the SAFECON event this year.

Heidi became a part of the Pilots for Patients family in August 2012 as an intern. She has since attended many events promoting PFP as our Special Events Coordinator, flown co-pilot on many missions and recently reached the 250 hour requirement to become an official volunteer pilot and flew her first mission this past November!

Florence grew up in Baton Rouge and married into a family from Coushatta. She has 4 grown children, 34, 33 and twins 31. She plays piano at her local Methodist Church, does stained glass and loves to fly!!! In 2008 one of her twin boys got his pilot license. One of his first flights was to take her on a flight over Shreveport and she loved every minute! His twin got his license 6 months later and, in her words, "This was too wonderful, I have to do it too." She enrolled in the NSU flight program and got her license in August of 2009.

She applied at a volunteer pilot organization but didn't have her IFR rating so she was not eligible to join them. Shortly after that, she flew her son Ben to the Pineville airport to take his written test, and saw a flyer for Pilots for Patients. She filled out the application while he was taking his test -- too excited at the possibility that she could actually do this!

Florence joined Pilots for Patients in January of 2011. Her first flight was with her IFR flight instructor taking patient Stephanie Bond Temple to Houston and it was wonderful all the way around. She was hooked - she could fly whenever she wanted, meet people that are such special friends AND do something good. She has a wonderful husband, Jim, who simply says "go fly - this is what we should be doing with our airplanes and our time!" They both pray for these special people.

She says "My twin sons are pilots (one has flown with me on a mission), my son-in-law became a pilot, and my husband is taking lessons!" In working with Pilots for Patients, we have found a whole new population of fine people and what a beautiful viewpoint of the world! Florence has flown 54 missions since joining.

We are very proud of both of these ladies and all the pilots on our roster. Our pilots are compassionate, dedicated and devoted to making a difference in the lives of so many people here in Louisiana and beyond. Thank you for all you do for Pilots for Patients.


